Infectious conjunctivitis	Red, itchy eyes; formation of discharge	5-12 days	No more discharge or redness visible	No
Vomiting, diarrhoea, (cause unknown)			48 hours after last bout of vomiting or diarrhoea; after first aid consultation, or exception in cases of migraine, travel sickness etc.	No
Norovirus infections; rotavirus infections; salmonella, campylobacter infections	Nausea; vomiting; diarrhoea, stomach cramps; high temperature	Norovirus infections: 1-2 days, rotavirus infections: 1-3 days, salmonella: 6-72 hours, campylobacter infections: 1-10 days	At least 48 hours after last bout of vomiting or diarrhoea. EHEC infection	Bloody diarrhoea; stomach pains; nausea; vomiting	2-10 days	Recovery and 3 negative stool samples	Yes
Hand, foot and mouth disease (incl. B08.4)	High temperature; sore throat; headache; aphthous mouth ulcers; skin rash on palms of hands and soles of feet	4-7 days	2 weeks after diagnosis (health authorities' guidelines)	Yes
Hepatitis A and E	Malaise, fatigue, gastrointestinal symptoms, itching (yellowing of the skin/eyes), weight loss; aching joints	15-50 days	1 week after yellowing of skin and eyes	Yes
Herpangina incl. B08.5	High temperature; blisters or sores on the gums or pharynx; loss of appetite, sore throat, headache, neck pain	1-5 days	2 weeks after diagnosis	Yes
Haemophilus influenza B (Hib)	High temperature, flu-like symptoms, severe headache, photophobic	2-4 days	After administering antibiotics and on recovery	Yes
Impetigo contagiosa (ringworm)	Pustules; yellow scabs; itching	2-10 days	24 hours after administering antibiotics, otherwise once healed up	Yes
Influenza (flu)	Typical flu symptoms	1-2 days	On recovery	Yes
Whooping cough (Pertussis)	Cold symptoms, hoarseness; high temperature; cough ranging from mild to intense coughing bouts with thick mucus	7-20 days	5 days after start of course of antibiotics, after three weeks with no course of antibiotics	Yes

<b>Headlice</b>	Itching on head, back of neck, behind the ears	Written confirmation of treatment from parents	After 1st treatment with a compound recommended by the Robert Koch Institute e.g. Nyda	No, daily check carried out by parents, 2nd treatment after 8 days
<b>Scabies</b>	Inflammation of the skin on wrists, between fingers and toes, in the navel and the chest and armpit area	14-42 days	After therapy and once healed up	Yes
<b>Pneumonia</b>	High temperature, productive or dry cough, chills, shortness of breath (in severe cases)	A few hours to several weeks	10 days after diagnosis	Yes
<b>Measles</b>	High temperature; conjunctivitis; cough; enanthem of the oral mucosa "Koplik spots"; crimson confluent rash (exanthem) starting on the face and behind the ears	8-14 days	On recovery, at least 5 days after the start of the rash	Yes
<b>Meningococcal meningitis</b>	Severe flu-like symptoms: high temperature; severe malaise, worsening headache becoming increasingly unbearable; photophobia	2-10 days	On recovery, at least 24 hours after starting course of antibiotics, prophylactic treatment with antibiotics for up to 10 days after contact a sensible precaution	Yes
<b>Mumps</b>	High temperature; swelling of parotid gland, unilateral or bilateral; pain when chewing	12-25 days	On recovery, at least 10 days after first swelling of gland	Yes
<b>Stomatitis</b>	High temperature, severe pain; reddening of the mouth; aphthous mouth ulcers, swelling of lymph nodes	2-12 days	On recovery	No
<b>Glandular fever</b>	Flu-like symptoms; swelling of lymph nodes; thickly-coated tonsils; bad breath, swelling of the spleen	7-30 days	On recovery	No
<b>Fifth disease (erythema infectiosum)</b>	Flu-like symptoms, butterfly-shaped rash on face; circular migrating rash on whole body	7-14 days	On first appearance of rash	No
<b>German measles (rubella)</b>	rash (exanthem) consisting of small spots starting on the face and spreading over the whole body; headache; swelling of lymph nodes; conjunctivitis	14-21 days	On recovery, at least one week after first appearance of rash	Yes
<b>Scarlet fever, Streptococcus A-tonsillitis (strep throat)</b>	Rash (exanthem): small raised spots (papules) on upper body, spreading to palms of hands and soles of feet; strawberry tongue; perioral pallor; high temperature; headache and sore throat; difficulty swallowing; swelling of lymph nodes; red, coated tonsils	1-3 days	24 hours after start of course of antibiotics, otherwise on recovery, approx. 2 weeks	Yes
<b>Tuberculosis</b>	Chronic slight temperature, night sweats, weight loss, painful breathing, chest pains	6-7 weeks after medical consultation	Proof of negative test	Yes

<b>Chicken pox</b>	Itchy rash (exanthem) with small blisters and scabs ("starry sky") on skin and mucous membranes, high temperature	8-28 days	After blisters have healed up, approx. 1 week	Yes
<b>Shingles</b>	Pain and blisters restricted to dermatome		After blisters have healed up, approx. 1 week	Yes
